MINUTES OF THE JOINT SAC AND SIMBAG MICROFINANCE ANNUAL GENERAL ASSEMBLY "Simbag sa Paglaom: SAC and Simbag Microfinance Bringing Hope to the Poor"

#### Ť. **Preliminaries**

The Joint SAC and Simbag Microfinance Annual General Assembly (GA) began with an opening prayer led by Fr. Wilson B. Bejo Jr. II, Simbag Microfinance Spiritual Director, followed by the singing of the National Anthem. Ms. Salvi Rufina Angela M. Morcoso, Simbag Microfinance Trustee and Overall Moderator, acknowledged all present, both physically and via remote communication, which includes the automatic, regular, and auxiliary members, Board of Trustees, Management, and Officers (attached to this minutes is the attendance sheet).

#### П. **Opening Message**

Fr. Eric B. Martillano, SAC Executive Director, started his opening message by warmly welcoming all guests and participants to the assembly. He began his address by simply reminding the significance of the gathering.

Fr. EB Martillano underscored that this event is more than just a meeting of two organizations; it represents a united and faith-driven force committed to serving the poor and fostering holistic development. Simbag Microfinance was acknowledged for its microfinance initiatives that plant seeds of hope and promote economic stability among communities, while SAC was recognized for its continued work in advocacy, development programs, and humanitarian aid, championing justice and extending compassion to those in need. Together, both institutions engage in intertwined ministries, reaching out to the marginalized and working to build a more just and compassionate society—an embodiment of the core values of the Gospel.

Lastly, Fr. EB Martillano asked for continued support and prayers from partners and stakeholders, with the shared goal of remaining faithful instruments of God's love and agents of transformative change throughout the Diocese of Legazpi and beyond.

Bishop JZ Baylon connected the occasion to the Feast of the Visitation, reflecting that, like Mary's visit to Elizabeth, the General Assembly is a visitation of God's grace, bringing assurance of His goodness and abundance.

Bishop JZ Baylon shared that as we gather for the Annual General Assembly of SAC and Simbag Microfinance during the Jubilee Year of Hope, we are reminded of Pope Francis' message in *Spes Non Confundit* - to be tangible signs of hope for those in hardship. He affirmed that both SAC and Simbag Microfinance are living expressions of this hope for the poor and vulnerable, not only within the diocese but throughout the region.

### In 2024, SAC Legazpi has served

- 450 walk-in clients, mostly for medical assistance;
- 1,445 malnourished children benefited from the feeding program, called INELP (Integrated Nutrition, Education, and Livelihood Program);
- 1,414 farming households and 80 organic farmers were assisted;
- 39 self-help groups, most of them in the island parishes, were organized under the SHEG and SILC projects. As of the end of 2024, they already have a combined savings of Php 2.8 million;
- The Diocesan Safeguarding Ministry was organized, with Parish Protection Desks organized in 6 parishes. Another 3 parishes join the new Justice and Peace Project with Caritas Philippines;
- In the 2025 national and local elections, our parishes were able to recruit almost 3,000 volunteers for the Parish Pastoral Council for Responsible Voting (PPCRV) and National Citizens' Movement for Free Elections (NAMFREL), who served as pollwatchers, voters' assistance desks, election monitors and emergency responders, and voter educators.

#### In 2024, Simbag Microfinance has served

- 95,478 member-microentrepreneurs, releasing P2.34 billion in loans, or P911 million total loan portfolio;
- Simbag MBA released microinsurance claims to 2,128 members and beneficiaries, amounting to P30.67 million. 65 members who died last year, and enrolled in the SEDP Care program, were given Php 10,000 assistance each, amounting to Php 650,000;

 SEDP MPC has given financial literacy and entrepreneurship trainings to 1,149 members; 6% of them have scaled up their businesses through product development, marketing, and mentoring assistance;

- Our Pili Hub, which is situated in Anislag Parish, has started operating. It seeks to develop the pili industry in our region and improve the lives of pili growers and entrepreneurs;
- Under Simbag Edukasyon, this school year, we provided scholarship grants to 404 college students, who are children of our members. An additional 5,250 elementary and high school learners were given school supplies.
- We have also established a partnership with the Scalabrinian Sisters and the Minghsin University of Science and Technology in Taiwan for a Study and Work Program that sends students to study Industrial Engineering courses while earning an income. After sending only two students in the previous terms, this time more children of members have applied for the next term;
- Our Simbag Salud medical missions have benefited 7,638 members and some nonmembers.

Bp JZ Baylon also shared that when Typhoon Kristine hit in November 2024, both the SAC and Simbag Microfinance provided emergency aid to over 34,000 families across Albay, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes. Over P16 million in relief was distributed: P3.35M by SAC, P8.6M by Simbag Microfinance, and P4.2M by Simbag MBA. Simbag Microfinance also launched a P100M zero-interest loan program and a new calamity microinsurance product to support disaster-affected members.

He also mentioned that the Diocese took a prophetic stand on ecological issues, advocating responsible quarrying and opposing harmful development on Mayon Volcano.

Inspired by Pope Leo XIV and the Church's social teachings, Bishop JZ Baylon urged SAC and Simbag Microfinance to remain steadfast in their mission — bringing hope and transforming society through the Gospel.

In his final message, Bishop JZ Baylon quoted Pope Leo XIV's Inaugural homily, highlighting the brokenness of our time - marked by hatred, violence, and marginalization. Yet, in response, the Church is called to be a small leaven of unity and fraternity, pointing others to Christ with humility and joy. He emphasized the call to build a Church rooted in God's love — a sign of unity and a missionary presence in the world, open to history and humanity. He emphasized that this is also our mission: to be instruments of God's love and agents of transformative change, especially for the poor, the vulnerable, the excluded, and even those who oppose or misunderstand us. Despite failures and setbacks, we trust that God will guide us. Quoting in local language, Bishop JZ Baylon affirmed, "Padagos po kita sa misyon" (Let us continue the mission).

#### VIII. Performance Highlights and Future Directions

The Simbag Microfinance's Accomplishment Report as of December 31, 2024 and projections for 2025 to 2027 were reported through a video presentation. It covered key areas such as operational reach, MSI (MBA and MPC), value-added services, current partners, operational status, the provision of calamity assistance, and the beneficiaries of its programs and services. The year 2024 was highlighted as a significant milestone for Simbag, marking its 30th anniversary, the inaugural Simbag Leaders Conference, and the rebranding of Simbag Microfinance from SEDP, reaccredited by the Microfinance NGO Regulatory Council (MNRC) for another three years.

The SAC accomplishment report from June 2024 to May 2025 was presented through a video presentation, highlighting significant progress across its core advocacy programs in nutrition, healthcare, education, livelihood, protection, empowerment, ecology, and disaster risk reduction and management (DRRM). Looking ahead, SAC reaffirms its commitment to sustaining all seven advocacy areas while placing increased emphasis on three priority programs: the expanded TADA initiative, ecology, and DRRM.

#### IX. Open Forum

Msgr. Crispin C. Bernarte, Jr., proposed to both Simbag Microfinance and SAC that, in the coming year, efforts be made to harmonize and align activities within the Diocese in preparation for the celebration of the 75th anniversary of the Diocese of Legazpi as a local church. Fr. RPB Arjona and Fr. EB Martillano have affirmed their commitment to supporting and implementing this initiative in the coming year.

Bp. JZ Baylon informed that the Diocese of Legazpi is preparing to commemorate its 75th anniversary, marking a significant milestone in its history as a local Church. The Diocese was officially separated from the then-Diocese of Caceres on June 29, 1951, and formally established with the installation of its first bishop on October 20, 1951. These two key dates—June 29 and October 20, 2026—will serve as the principal celebrations of the Diocese's Diamond Jubilee, recognizing both its canonical
